Student News and Notes - Spring



It is the perfect workshop for BUSY people ... into our six hours together, we fit in the essential 'basics' and extend into some of our advanced skills too ... perfect for textiles teachers, as well as patchworkers and quilters, and dressmakers ... anyone wanting to learn our skills 'in a hurry' to be able to create amazing hand-designed fabrics ... all with the simplicity and safety of our unique product, Liquid Radiance.
- The two-day 'Fabulous Fabrics' program has been a favourite for many years now, as it thoroughly develops an understanding of colouring techniques and opens up a huge variety of possibilities for participants to explore different 'effects' with confidence after the workshop is over.
- ❖ Traditional Silk Painting can be traced back to its origins in Southern Europe around 500 years ago, but with modern paint technology, we have made it simple for anyone to achieve these exquisite effects. No artistic skills necessary! Just a burning desire to create something beautiful and unique.
- ❖ The Advanced Techniques workshops include skills like traditional batik and discharge using our safe, simple methods to achieve the same results, but without the 'hassles' that have made these skills thought of as 'difficult' or 'messy' in the past. Loads more is covered in this day too, depending on techniques learned by those attending in the past so everything is fresh and new. Attendance at a previous 'basics' workshop is a pre-requisite for attending this program.



Free Motion Machine Quilting takes as its inspiration the hand-coloured fabrics created during our workshops and develops them to a new level in fabric designing. Whether making entire quilts or small projects – jackets, bags, cushions, you name it! – the end result will be uniquely yours. Really, it's learning to draw using the sewing machine needle instead of a pencil. I teach tracing and stenciling methods as part of this comprehensive two-day program ... and the simplest sewing machine can achieve it. No expensive machines required – but if you have one, that's OK too.

Mmmm ... Tulips everywhere! ... it really MUST be spring !!!

Here's a quick lesson so you can ...'CONVERT' YOUR PHOTOS TO A TRACING ... ready to use for whatever project you have in mind:

STEP 1: Photocopy or print your photo in black and white – it is simpler to choose the parts of your design without colours to affect your judgment. (Use the coloured photo later for your designing.)

STEP 2: Using a fat juicy felt pen (preferably black or a dark colour), trace the lines of your chosen design areas directly onto the black-and-white photocopied page. The lines will soak through the paper.

STEP 3: Flip the page over and you'll see your design very clearly! – much more easily than trying to trace it from the 'photo' side of the paper.

NOTE: Of course your design will be in reverse to the original this way. If you want it facing the same way as the original, simply retrace it onto translucent unwaxed greaseproof paper and flip it back to the 'right way' for you.

REMINDER: *Liquid Radiance is NOT a dye*. Let's refer to it as a **COLOUR**. It is a 'finely milled liquid acrylic' formulation that is SO FINE that it penetrates fibres in the same way as dye does. AND it is safe and simple to use, and economical as well. And uniquely OURS!

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However because it is DIFFERENT from a dye, we cannot always use the same method of applying it to the fabric as you would with a dye.

That's why it is so important to understand it and learn to use it correctly, via our classes and workshops; or my DVDs that are designed to help you when you cannot attend our teaching programs, or to use as a back-up after a workshop to enable you to revise and revisit the skills whenever you wish.
