This oh-so-simple layering and mopping up technique creates unbelievable results by colouring just two pieces of fabric and strategically placing salt to end up with three or four pieces that will go together perfectly for your patchwork, dressmaking, and home décor projects. Follow the rules as you see them in my article, then try other combinations for simply stunning results.

Making the Most of Our Painting Techniques ... LEAF PRINTING ... let's rejuvenate an old favourite, and build up a design from that ...

Springtime is a great season to be out in the garden. Let's go hunting for some suitable leaves (including weeds) to help us with our creativity. You'll need leaves with a slightly furry reverse side, and an interesting vein pattern.

Go grab a geranium and stick the flower in your hat, then pick a handful of different sized leaves. They'll be perfect for printing. Other leaf favourites? Pineapple sage, chrysanthemums, hibiscus, many different herbs, dandelions, long grasses ... see what else you can find. Pick them with a little bit of stem to act as a 'handle'. Place them between layers of damp paper towel to keep them fresh for working. Dry, crackly leaves are not suitable for printing.

METHOD:

- Rest your leaf vein side upwards on some scrap paper then paint your chosen Flat paint (or Liquid Lustre) onto the leaf using a softish hog's hair bristle brush, or our Elite brush #4 or #6..
- Flip the painted leaf over and position it on your fabric.
- Cover it with another sheet of clean old paper and rub your hand evenly over the entire area. Carefully lift leaf of the fabric.
- 4. Build up your design as desired, leaf by leaf, repeating the steps above.

SETTING THE PAINT: Leave Flat paints for three days to cure in the fabric before washing, but prints are dry in just a
