Let the flowers of Spring inspire you for your creative projects ...

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
G'day Fellow Teachers and Fabric Enthusiasts!




these spring mornings, it's a pleasure to have the scents of the garden rushing in.



Making the Most of our Painting Ideas and Techniques ... Soy Wax Batik ... If you have ever been 'put off' by all the 'difficulties' of removing paraffin wax from traditional batik work (as was I many years ago!), you'll find this technique much simpler by using professional grade soy wax,



available from candle supplies stores, as well as from us in small quantities - and it lasts for ages so you don't need lots for your projects! Check out my YouTube video for the detailed how-to when working with multiple layers of wax and colour. One result of this technique is seen in the green, white and grey image at left. It was done using four alternating layers of wax and colour.

Fabric at right (A) is a two layer 'play' inspired by commercial fabric that made me think, 'We can do that too', using multi colours in the base layer, then adding

stronger multi-colours after the wax has been added and is dry (B & C). I used a detergent lid as my waxing device – the knob made a very handy handle! – and a small bristle brush to create the dots. If you learned about this new skill during our celebration workshops in July, and have tried your own version of it, please let me know and send me the pics via SMS or email. I'd love to see your variations on this technique!

BENEFITS OF SOY WAX: it is environmentally safe, it melts at a low temperature (you can even use an oil burner to prepare the wax for small projects), and is removed simply using hot sudsy water. SOOOO good! Such GREAT results!!!


