

Our lesson for this summer ... "WATER MARKING" ... soft, subtle colours, or bold and bright, as you wish ...



Water marking is a super simple technique for creating random patterns, especially on large pieces of fabric. Works wonderfully on all fabrics!

Make quilt backs that are exclusively yours. Design fabrics for lingerie and dressmaking. 'Dress up' your plain bed linen. And who needs plain curtain backs when colour could be WAY more interesting ?!? Have fun with this technique!!!



METHOD:

- 1. Onto a large table surface or your garage floor! spread a piece of plastic that is slightly bigger than the fabric you plan to colour. Hold it to the table or floor with masking tape.
- 2. Wet your fabric, and squeeze out the excess water. However, for this technique we need to keep the fabric a little wetter than usual, as long as it is not dripping with water.
- 3. Flop your fabric onto the plastic randomly. It will form hills and valleys. You can scrunch it a little more if you wish, but NOT TOO TIGHTLY or you'll lose the patterns you're trying to form.
- 4. Drop or drizzle your chosen colours onto the fabric, allowing PLENTY of room between them so they can spread.

Do not fill the fabric with colour at this stage.



- 6. The darks and lights of the pattern will form as the colours are drying. You'll see this in the photos above.
- 7. When dry, lift fabric off the plastic and heat set the Liquid Radiance colours in the usual way: iron for ½ minute for strong colours, but up to 2 minutes for really pale colours, with iron set on a temperature suitable for the fabric.
