G'day Fabric-a-holics and Fellow Teachers,

The KISS Principle ... Writing projects for *Embellish* magazine has been a genuine pleasure since I was first asked to do so in 2017. Then late last year, Editor Lynda gave me the magazine themes until 2025. I love doing the 'head scratching' to come up with something a little different for you to try with each project I submit. But I ALWAYS MAKE SURE it's EASY to achieve, and EFFECTIVE as a result. The amazing dots above are crazily simple to do, and you'll find these along with other 'dotty things' in the March issue of the magazine (#57). Yes, **"Keep It Simple, Silly!"**

Still KISS-ing! ... When designing, I love to use equipment that is easy to find around the home. With our non-toxic paints and colours, it's great to be able to take crockery and utensils from the kitchen cupboards as required, then wash them up and put them away again for use with food. It's all part of my 'Safe, Simple, Economical – and

IMPORTANT: When dunking with one colour in a dish – eg doing socks, garments, large pieces of fabric – leftovers should be bottled separately as they may contain fibres, or traces of detergent (or other grot). Label them so you remember where they came from. Do NOT put these left-overs back into the bottle they came from when first diluted with water.

Sustainable' thinking. It's perfectly safe to put

clean-up water down the regular drains or onto the garden with no environmental impact too. And if you have mixed too much colour for your project, bottle and label it, and put it aside for the future. No waste!

Even more KISSING ... One of the joys of shopping is to see and feel the items you are planning to buy, right? You can tell that I'm NOT an on-line shopper eh?! I prefer the personal touch. For our local ladies, and customers

Making the Most of our Ideas and Techniques Playing on a Bread Crate or Other 'Grid' ...

Always looking for something new and interesting to do, I had been bottling our LR colours and had a puddle of spilt concentrate just waiting to be mopped up. With a couple of calico bags handy, I wet them (of course!), then added more water to the conc colours and went to work, making sure the fabric was evenly coloured to show the pattern best.


BAG on LEFT was formed into a spiral, working flat on a board. It was then eased carefully

onto a nursery crate, trying not to disturb the spiral as I did this; then pressed to flatten it a little to help the 'fractured' pattern develop on the flat grid of the crate. With the air able to 'get at' the colour both above and below the grid, the different patterns developed on each side of the bag as the fabric dried.

There's no reason why this cannot be done effectively on single layer fabric too – or maybe try two layers of fabric done together to create two fabrics to match perfectly for your sewing project.
