
Hi Fellow Textile Teachers and Fabric Enthusiasts,

Welcome to another super season of creative ideas via my newsletter! Yesterday afternoon was the last Sunday of Autumn and I had a wonderful day 'fixing things' ... in my Studio. You know how sometimes you create something and it isn't quite right? Or you colour some fabric and it isn't 'just perfect' for your project? There was even one of my favourite hand-coloured bags that had met with foul play when an 'oops' of colour arrived on it! (Grrrr!) So I thought this could be a great opportunity to share a few 'fix it' thoughts with you ...



Stencils in Flat paint are used to disguise plain or 'disastrous' fabrics!



- 1. Adding a stencilled design in flat paints or Liquid Lustres can 'distract the eye' from the bits you don't like, and give your work an exciting new focus.
- 2. For a piece of 'wrong coloured' fabric, completely recolouring it works wonderfully well. Remember that the base colour will affect the colour/s you add so take this into account when you choose your next coat/s of colour; and keep the extra layer fairly plain if the colour you're 'fixing' was boldly textured; or vice versa if the base colour was quite plain. Scrunching the fabric when you've added the second colour will 'texture' back to the base colour of course. Extra colours added should be darker that the original base colour for best effect.
- 3. A favourite 'fix it' of mine is to add extra dark colour to the 'base coat' then add salt (or sugar) to texure the added colours to reveal what's underneath. This works best if the fabric is not scrunched (or very gently scrunched) so the beauty of the salt markings will be given a chance to dominate and enhance the design.

HINTS: Remember that your fabric will become stiff if you've left excess colour in it at any stage. Be careful not to overload the fibres with colour! "Excess is the Enemy" rule always applies when using Liquid Radiance. When adding stencils in Flat paints, make sure the base fabric is totally dry so the stencilled paint doesn't bleed.

In the coming few months ... I'm taking the opportunity to head to warmer climes for the 'postponed' workshops.



For You to Play With ... Wintry Leaves ... these Japanese Maple leaves are brush painted through a stencil, then tinted with Liquid Radiance colour concentrates to produce an endless range of brilliant metallic colours. Compare the centre right leaf with the others in the photo. The centre right has been painted using silver, gold and copper only. The rest of the leaves have started with the same base Lustres then tinted with purple, blue and green at random, blending them as I worked. Steps ...

- 1. Lay stencil onto dark fabric it will really zing up the metallic colours.
- 2. Dispense Lustres onto a palette, then apply them using a firm brush our Elite range of brushes are perfect for this task. Start brush strokes well back from the edge of the stencil and work into the design area, following the shape of the veins in the leaf for best optical effect. OPTION leave a small area of the fabric showing for interesting contrast, as I have.
  - 3. Leave stencil in place when Lustre base is finished.
  - 4. Drop just one or two drops of Liquid Radiance

concentrate into the palette dish. Choose two or three colours and blend them as you work. When the base coat is dry, brush the LR colours in the same direction as the Lustre base coat for consistency.

5. Iron to heat set when dry.
