MAKING THE MOST OF OUR PAINTING TECHNIQUES ... Palette Mop-Ups, Perfect for designing striped fabric ...



1. Dampen fabric and concertina scrunch it.

2. Place chosen colours in the dishes of the palette – I have separated them with water in every alternate dish to avoid overload.

3. Press the fabric into the dishes, flipping it over to make sure colours penetrate right through the layers then pinching the fabric between the colours to encourage them to blend.

4. Spread fabric onto plastic and work the colours together a little more if you wish. Remember: "While there's moisture there's movement." The colours will bleed together while they are drying anyway!

5. Check for excess. "Excess is the enemy." Blot it out if required.

6. Form your desired pattern: Scrunch it into hills and valleys, form random scrunches or stripes, or whatever! Salt it if you wish. Tickle it into small scrunches and lean on it (air exclusion). Or simply lay it flat to dry.

7. Heat set when dry. Make sure you rinse the fabric well before ironing it if you have used salts or sugars, or 'things' like water soluble resist.

For large pieces of fabric, prepare the colours in shallow take-away food containers, place them a small distance (2 to 4 cms) apart and follow the steps above. This is also the perfect way to colour skeins of thread for variegated effects. Have fun playing!
