SOME IDEAS AND INSPIRATIONS FOR YOU



ABSTRACTION – one of my very favourite of favourites! It has been cut as an A3 size stencil and used for Heliography over Liquid Radiance colours. A strip of the design was then painted in Purple for Light Fabric and Metallic Gold using rollers. Masking tape was then placed carefully on the stencil to define the section required to complete the project.

The beauty of Liquid Lustres combined with Liquid Radiance concentrates has

been used to stencil JAPANESE MAPLE and FEATHERS at right. Gentle sponging in Copper Lustre was used to enhance the feather. Design was brushed onto the fabric using Elite Brush #6. Always use the right brush, and the size appropriate for the area into which you are working.


HIBISCUS was painted on silk using Water Soluble Batik technique. The resist was soaked in water then washed


out when the painted background was completely dry.

background.














HINT: When tracing shapes onto stencil sheets, make sure you leave enough space between the shape and edge of stencil, and between shapes, to make it easier to paint. This way your brush or roller is not 'straying' into unwanted areas.











When our children were small, it was our family pleasure to grow pansies (still do!), then pick the blooms and arrange them to float in a pie dish of water as a centrepiece for our meal table. 
Flat paints, or using Liquid Radiance for traditional silk painting techniques. Enjoy ... ©


ENLARGE (OR REDUCE) THESE DESIGNS TO SUIT THE SIZE OF YOUR PROJECT.



Freestyle Flowers lends Prints or fine brush work.


Place shapes at random for contemporary home décor - cushions, curtains, even tea towels. Our Flat paints are soft to feel, so do not correctly.

Use the design vertically for quilt borders ... and fabric designing in general so your fabrics are uniquely yours.



Capture the rich colours of autumn by painting these exquisite leaves in Liquid Lustres combined with Liquid Radiance concentrate. Or for a more 'solid' result, use Metallic Flats along with Flats for Light or Dark Fabric. These look stunning when painted on black fabric or on other dark colours like navy, maroon, or bottle green!

A perfect design for traditional silk techniques and glass painting. Have fun exploring our new product, Gloss, as a glass paint and a resist for silk painting when tinted with Liquid Radiance, as well as a glaze (full gloss, satin finish, or matte 'varnish') on wood and other surfaces.

EACH SHAPE CAN BE USED ON ITS OWN, OR 'PULLED APART' TO USE SMALL SECTIONS OF YOUR CHOICE.





To paint the flames in two different colours, prepare two stencils, one with the blocked-in shapes cut out and the outlined shapes shown as dotted lines. The second stencil will have the blocked shapes as dotted lines, and the outlined shapes cut out. It will then be simple to match up the shapes to fit perfectly together.

These designs are perfect for Stencilling techniques.




WINDMILL

An iconic Australian shape that has been part of our landscape for more than 100 years.

PAINTING NOTIONS:

- > Cut a stencil of the solid areas of the design.
- Paint using rollers, as a silhouette in black or any other really dark colour (eg Olive, Chocolate, Genesis Purple from the Flats range.)
- Use the fine black marking pen to complete the details of the windmill structure.



AFTERNOON RIDE

Create a stencil shape from a map of Australia. Place it on your fabric or garment, then create the


A sensational Australian silhouette! silhouette scene within the shape of the map. Remember to include Tasmania.

IDEAS:

Paint a watercolour background; then when this is completely dry, add the silhouette as a stencil in black or our own deep rich colour, Genesis Purple.

HINT: Ground area can be created using a line of wide masking tape if you wish. Tear the edge of the tape a little to make the ground look rough. When horses' paint is dry, place the tape over the horse area of the design overlapping the legs slightly so there are no gaps between the end of the legs and the ground.

OR: Prepare a separate stencil for the ground. If you try to make one stencil for the whole design, the areas under the horses' bodies and between the legs will fall out! Paint the horses, then add the ground, slightly overlapping the two sections of the design so the horses are not 'floating' above the ground.



Extend and round off the 'ends' of the grass section as desired.
